At the state show in youth one first, two seconds, one sixth.

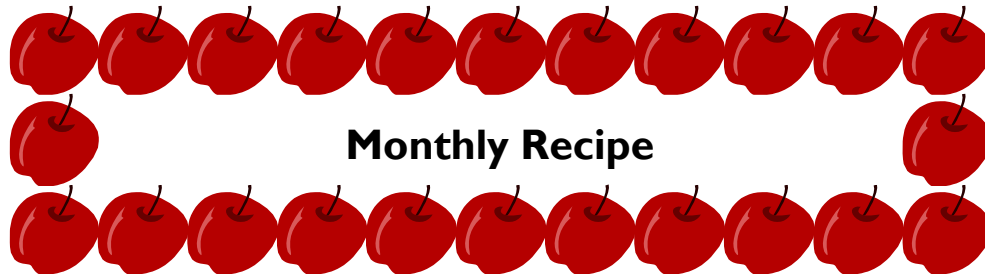
In adults three seconds and one sixth.

Monthly Recipe

Shortcut Shepherd's Pie Serves 8

Ingredients:

Filling:

2.5 lb ground sirloin
1 10 oz bag peas and carrots
1 teaspoon ground black pepper
1 TBSP Onion Powder

½ cup flour
1 tablespoon salt
1 can beef broth
2 TBSP Cornstarch

Topping:

1 bag Steam and Mash Potatoes per dish for medium layer.
¼ cup butter per bag potatoes
1 egg
1/3 cup milk per bag potatoes
1 cup shredded cheese per bag potatoes
Enough shredded cheese to cover casserole

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
Brown ground sirloin in large pan.
Add bag of peas and carrots, stir until they thaw.
Then add onion powder and flour.
Stir.
Add can of beef broth to make a thick gravy.
Divide mixture into two 8 X 8 inch casserole pans.
Place Steam and Mash potatoes in microwave for 10 minutes.
Let the sit for 5 minutes then open, careful of the hot steam.
Mix in bowl with butter, egg, milk and cheese.
Spread potato mixture on top of meat mixture.
Cover with shredded cheese.
Place in oven for about 30 minutes if being made fresh.
Cover the second pan and place in the freezer.
To prepare frozen dish, thaw overnight in fridge.



Beef mixture can also be made ahead of time and frozen in individual freezer containers, then thawed and placed into casserole dish(es).

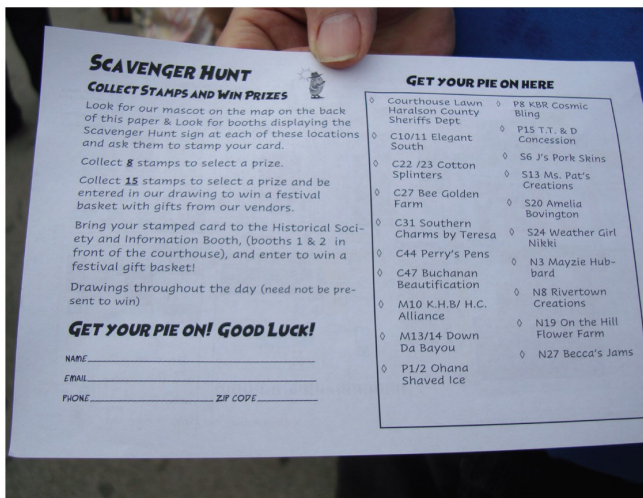

We had everything from laughs, good rides, cool weather, hot weather, good food and wine. We had paved road, dirt road, concrete parking lots and gravel and even one flat tire (a little drama just to shake things up a little).

All of the places were "Farm to Fork", which means the the farm that grows it, sells it. We rode down to Tifton, stopping at some farm stores and a couple of "Grand Tour of Georgia" stops along the way. The first day we rode to Dickey Farms just to see what they had and got a little snack before off to the next place. All of these "Farm Stores" had all kinds of Jams, Jellies, Wine, Pecans or Hot Sauce, just depending on what they grew.

Then, off to Howard Johnson's Motel. Now, you didn't have to stay at HJ but Candace set up this ride, and we all seemed to wind up there which worked out great.

Already people are making changes to their tool kit to include a few more items that will make any “unforeseen” repairs “doable”. I’m not saying we didn’t have what we needed, I’m just saying.
